# History

In 1988, the Friends of the Library opened the Benbrook Library in a building donated by the City of Benbrook and the Water Department. It was operated entirely by volunteers. A petition drive was held by the Friends to form a library district, which is funded, operated, and governed independent of the city. The initiative succeeded, and the citizens voted a 1/2 percent sales tax to operate a Benbrook Library District. The sales tax has allowed the library to be professionally staffed and governed by a Library Board of Directors.

Since the beginning of the library in 1999, the population of Benbrook has remained fairly stable (2020: 24,500), but visits to the library have drastically increased. This is, in part, due to our staff who are consistently creating new and exciting programs for all ages. Our patrons check out almost thrice as many items compared to other Texas libraries of a similar size with merely a quarter of the average Texas library space!


# **GET YOUR LIBRARY CARD**



In order to sign up for a resident card, patrons must present a valid state-issued ID with a Benbrook address or zip code in 76126 on it and a piece of recent, first-class mail with the same address. The checkout limit is 50 items, including 10 DVDs (20 per family), 2 video games, 2 kits, 2 BOB books, and 1 WIFI hotspot. With this card, patrons will also have access to all of our physical and digital materials.

Non-Residents

If you live outside of Benbrook or the 76126 zip code, Fort Worth, or you are not served by a MetroShare library, then you qualify for a non-resident card. To obtain one, come in and provide a valid state-issued ID & piece of mail with the same address on it. The checkout limit is 25 items, including 10 DVDs (20 per family), 1 kit, 1 BOB books, and 1 WIFI hotspot. With this card, patrons will also have access to all of our physical and digital materials.



Children can have their own card under their parent or guardian's account. There is no minimum age requirement; anyone under the age of 18 can obtain a library card. Parents or guardians of anyone under 18 must sign an agreement that they will be responsible for their children before a card is issued. Some collections are restricted to children. If parents wish to restrict their children from borrowing types of materials, it's the responsibility of the parents to enforce that restriction.



# METROSHARE LIBRARIES

If you have a library card with one of our MetroShare partner libraries (Burleson, Decatur, Forest Hill, Haltom City, Haslet, Keller, Richland Hills, Roanoke, Saginaw, or Watauga), you may use your card at Benbrook Public Library!

# Books

We have book collections for all ages. Each includes fiction, non-fiction, biographies, and audiobooks. Our special sub-collections include large print for adults, Spanish language books for all ages, graphic novels for all ages. Picture books, board books, easy readers, and award winners for children.

# Media

We have four adult computers that have Windows 10 and Microsoft Office, as well as three library booths that are meant for single users. We have laptops available for in-library use. You may also access our free Wi-Fi on your own device.

Print wirelessly from your laptop, phone, or tablet. You can even send your print job from home and pick it up!





# Special Collections

- The Library of Things is a collection of kits that facilitate a variety of educational, recreational, and practical activities. Kits in the collection include musical instruments, a telescope, video games, a projector, knitting supplies, and more. Most kits contain books and other materials that provide instruction and guidance on the activity they support. Library of Things kits are available to Benbrook Public Library cardholders ages 18 and up and are limited to one per borrower.
- Our early literacy kits for children include themed combinations of books, toys, games, and other manipulatives to encourage a love of reading. You'll find kits on bugs, dinosaurs, bedtime, and more!
- We have video games available for Switch, Xbox One, and PlayStation 4
  gaming consoles. Adult Benbrook residents, non-residents, and
  MetroShare cardholders are welcome to check out two video games at
  a time for three weeks.
- Our Seed Library offers local gardeners a variety of fruit, vegetable, and flower seeds to choose from. If you would like to save seeds from your harvest and share them with the community, just bring them by the library and donate them to the seed collection.



This is a space built just for you to dream, plan, and create; all ages are welcome. We have a variety of innovative tools available for in-house use at the library.

The MakerSpace is a place for YOU to learn and create. Library staff provide guidance but leave the vision and execution of the projects to you. Training is available to help you learn how to operate the equipment safely to complete your projects with the results you hope to achieve.

# Laser Engraver

We currently have a Fusion Pro 36 laser engraver. It has a bed size of 36"x24", will cut 1/4" wood or acrylic, and is 60 watts. We also have a rotator that will allow you to print on cylindrical tumblers, mugs, etc. Materials available are wood at a cost of \$.05/sq.in and acrylic at a cost of \$.10/sq.in, plus tax. Engraving is free if you bring your own material.



## Cricut

We have a Cricut Maker that will cut vinyl, cardstock, leather, pleather, and numerous other materials. We also have a good selection of pens to draw on your projects. Our supplies are all at cost, plus tax.

## Sublimation Printer

We have a SG 500 that prints full color images on any sublimation ready material. Transfer designs onto materials using heat and pressure on apparel, home decor, etc.



# 3-D Scanner

We have a CR-Scan Ferret Pro to create 3-D Models. It is a wireless scanner with 0.1mm accuracy; compatible with MAC, IOS, windows, and Android. Scanner will help you create a digital model of a physical object by capturing its shape, height, width, and depth.

## Poster Printer

We have a Canon Imageprograf 4100 Poster Printer to handle all your poster needs. We have two sizes of paper, 24" and 36" wide. We have bond and glossy paper available. All files must be in PDF format to print successfully and preferably brought to us on a flash drive. The final cost is determined by the ink, paper, and material type used, plus tax.



# Embroidery Machine

We have a Brother 1700 Embroidery Machine complete with a 6"x10" area and 8.3" area from needle to arm. Compatible with iBroidery to personalize shirts, hats, aprons, & much more.

## 3-D Printer

We have three Polyprinter 229 model 3D Printers available for use. We primarily use ABS, plastic PLA, and PETG. Cost is calculated at \$.10/ gram, plus tax. For ideas, visit www.thingiverse.com



# Heat Press

We have a Vevor heat press with a 16"x16" plate to transfer designs. Equipped with hat, mug, and tumbler press.

Attendees read aloud from their writing projects and receive notes, praise, and constructive criticism from their fellow writers.




#### Yoga with Ginger Second Monday of each month at 6:00 pm

# libby

Libby offers a large selection of ebooks, audiobooks, and magazines for checkout. You can check out 3 items at a time, and each item can be borrowed for up to 14 days.



- Download the free Libby app on your phone or tablet.
- Sign in using your library card.
- Browse the collection of ebooks and audiobooks.
- When you find an item, click borrow.
- Choose to download the item or read/listen in an internet browser.
   To browse magazines, click on "Subjects" and then click "Magazines."
   You may check out as many as you'd like!

# cloudLibrary

CloudLibrary offers a collection of over 170,000 ebooks and audiobooks to enjoy. You can check out 3 items at a time, and each item can be borrowed for up to 14 days.



- Download the cloudLibrary app (it's free!). Or, visit yourcloudlibrary.com on your computer.
- In cloudLibrary, choose your state and library.
   Create an account using your Benbrook library card number (on the back of your library card) and the pin associated with your library card.
   Your PIN will be the last four digits of your phone number unless you customize it.
- Browse the collection of ebooks and audiobooks.
- When you find an item you want, click on the title and then click "Borrow."
- Borrowed titles appear under "My Books" in the app. You can stream your items or download them to your device to enjoy them offline.

# kanopy

Benbrook Library gives you 6 credits to watch movies each month. Depending on the title, you have 48 or 72 hours to finish a film after pressing play.

With hoopla, you can borrow movies, music, ebooks, audiobooks, and comics. Titles can be borrowed immediately, and the length of time an item can be borrowed depends on the item type. You may borrow 10 items per month with hoopla.

# Board of Trustees

The Benbrook Library is governed by a five-member board of trustees. This board is elected by you, the voters of Benbrook. Each trustee is elected for a two-year term. The terms are staggered, so there is a Library Board election each year. Library trustees must be residents of Benbrook and registered voters.

The Board of Trustees meets monthly, usually on the fourth Monday, at 5:30 pm. These meetings are open to the public, and we invite you to attend. The agenda is posted in the library and on our website at least three days prior to each meeting, and notice of the meetings is usually listed on the city cable channel.
